Instructions for Housesitters

Our trip plans:

Depart from SFO on xxxx. Return to SFO on xxxx at 8:45am. We will probably take CalTrain back to San lose

Instructions for Care of the Cat, Sylvie

- Keep dry food available
- Keep her water bowl/electric fountain full
 - Clean out bowl every week or so, it gets a little grimy
 - Be sure water bowl doesn't run out of water and run dry (If you will go away for a day or two you may want to unplug it while you are gone so that if it runs low, it won't damage the motor)
- Scoop litter every few days
 - Change the whole litter every two weeks (more if you want, we are lazy :)
- Apply Advantage flea treatment to back of her neck on March 28
- We took her into the vet on 2/26 because of 3 red, raw spots on her belly that she had been licking, and three scabs on her back, tail and leg that she had been licking. They said she has an unidentified allergy (either food, fleas, or pollen). They told me to switch her food back to one she had been eating prior to this outbreak (Purina One Tuna/Salmon), give her flea treatment every 3 weeks instead of four (she'll be due on March 28), give her an antibiotic for one week, and spray a disinfectant spray (Vetricyn VF) on the lesions as needed. She should be mostly healed up by the time we leave, but we will leave you with the spray to use if you notice any new scabs or red spots.
- Yell at her when she scratches on the couch
- She will want you to let her sit in your lap ALL DAY
- She will want you to let her sleep on your pillow ALL NIGHT. If you don't want her in the bed with you, close the doors (she may meow to be let in I don't know, we always let her sleep with us)

Other things to know about the House:

- Garbage/Recycling Service's pick up on Monday morning (put garbage and recycling cans out in front of the house on Sunday night)
- Yard waste/compost pickup is also on Monday morning. You don't have to do anything in the
 yard (we plan to have it cleaned up and mostly weeded by the time you come, but if you do
 have any trimmings and/or lots of food waste, you can leave it in a pile in front of the house on
 Sunday night.
- We do compost normal food waste in a big black bin on the right side of the house. Feel free to use it or not, whatever you wish.
- Water indoor potted plants as needed. I don't have a very green thumb, and have no plants of sentimental value so I don't care if anything withers ©

- The landlord hires a gardener to come by and maintain the front lawn every few months. They will just come do the work and not disturb you.
- Feel free to eat the oranges on the tree out back, and any lemons that fall off of the next door neighbor's tree into our yard
- The gate going into the back yard is warped so it is hard to close. It is challenging to get closed, but you can slam it hard, so don't worry about it breaking.

Public Transportation:

Most of these things we mention are in walking distance, but if you want to go farther out you can use the Google Transit Planner: http://www.google.com/intl/en/landing/transit/#mdy or check out the route maps on the website of the Santa Clara County Valley Transportation Authority (VTA): http://www.vta.org/. They operate local buses and light rail trains that go all around Santa Clara County.

Example trips:

- It's a 1.5 mile walk to the Coleman shopping center that has the Target/Trader Joes/Sweet Tomatoes restaurant, OR you can get a bus. From M-F it's the 11 Bus (that stops right across the street), and on weekends you would take the 62 Bus that stops at the corner of Taylor and 13th)
- If you walk or take a bus to the nearest VTA Light Rail station (Japantown/Ayer) you can take that south to Downtown San Jose. Continue south to the San Jose-Diridon Transit Center and change trains to get one that goes to the nice, walkable downtown Campbell. Or you could take a northbound train that goes all the way to nice, walkable downtown Mountain View.
- At either San Jose—Diridon or Mountain View you can transfer to the CalTrain (regional rail: http://www.caltrain.com/) that goes to all the way to San Francisco.

• From San Jose-Diridon station, you can transfer to a bus that will take you to downtown Santa Cruz. It's a very comfortable commuter bus with cozy seats and even Wi-fi (the light rail trains also have Wi-fi now, I believe)

If you need a taxi to go somewhere local and don't want to deal with transit, we use Rainbow Taxi (408-271-9900).
